Summer Ball!

While it seems like the spring season has just started, we are already halfway through the season, and registration for co-ed summer ball is coming up! Look for registration to open on June 7th (priority will be given to spring ball players). NOTE: Players will receive a summer hat and dry fit (team uniform) with their registration so please make sure to update shirt sizes in your registration.

Co-ed summer ball is generally considered to be more competitive than Spring, however, with 3 levels in most divisions, there are still opportunities for all skill levels to participate. Our summer season, for most age groups, starts after Canada Day and continues until the second last week of August. At the senior level, the summer season can start in the last week of June. At the rookie to senior levels, our summer teams interlock with other Little Leagues within the City of Ottawa and surrounding areas.

Player placement on teams begins with the top-tier team, the all-star tournament team, and cascades downward from there. The next level offered is placement on 1 Canadian (A) level team, followed by 1 or more national (B) level teams. Note: rookie doesn't run an all-star team. There are 12 spots available on the all-star team. It is a tournament team and requires a significantly greater time and travel commitment (than A or B.) Like spring ball, the Canadian and national teams usually have 13-14 players.

The sort outs for the all-star teams took place in late May. If players elected not to try out, or were not selected for the all-star teams, but wish to play summer ball, there will be another round of try-outs in mid to late June. These will determine placement on Canadian or national teams.

Our summer season, for most age groups, starts after Canada Day and continues until the second last week of August. At the senior level, the summer season can start in the last week of June. The all girls season for rookie - junior continues until late July.

At the Rookie to Senior levels, our summer teams interlock with other Little Leagues within the City of Ottawa and surrounding areas. This summer, OWLL will be offering teams in the following divisions:
