Minor provincials start this week!!



It's finally here - OWLL is excited to be hosting minor provincials from July 27 – August 2, 2024. There are no national championships in the minor division, so this tournament is the high point of the minor season in Ontario.

The tournament features players aged 9 and 10 from the Oakville Whitecaps, East Nepean Eagles, Timmins Lynx, Windsor West, Orleans Red Sox, Kingston Colts, Perth Royals, and Ottawa West Twins! Round robin game play starts on Saturday, August 27th, and the opening ceremonies will be at Pinecrest major, 4:00p.m. on the 27th. The complete (and packed!) game schedule can be found below.

The road to the Little League **World Series**

The district tournament is the first step for a team on the way to the World Series. Once a team from District 2 (OWLL, East Nepean, and Kanata) wins the round robin district tournament, they advance to the Ontario championship, where they play against teams from all districts in the province. These tournaments typically involve five to eight teams, and follow either a round robin or double elimination format. If a team is successful at provincials, they'll advance to the Canadians. Teams at Canadians represent generally their province, although some provinces (i.e. the Atlantic provinces) are grouped together and they send one team to represent the region. The winner of the Canadian championship plays in the World Series.

Four age levels have a World Series: major, intermediate, junior, and senior. They all play in different tournaments at different times in the summer - the final tournament of the Little League season is the Little League World Series, for major, which happens in late August. Minor teams don't have a World Series - their tournament season ends after provincials.

When a team from Canada advances to their level's World Series, they will be seeded into the international bracket. The bracket is ten teams for major, and six teams at the three other ages. The teams in the international bracket compete against each other for the right to play the champion of the American bracket the tournament final.
