Fall wrap up and annual general meeting

October brought the end to our fall seasons, and preparation for winter and spring ball. There is not a lot of baseball that happens in the fall months, but there is a lot of work behind the scenes to prepare for next year.

Our AGM was held at the end of October, and we reviewed the operational aspects of the league, elected some new and returning board members, and handed out some awards to very deserving individuals. In this issue we will share some of the highlights, starting with president Sarah Futterer's opening remarks:

"After a full year of "presidenting" under my feet, 2023 has been another exceptional year for our league. It is apparent, after sending 3 of 5 all star teams past district play this year, and having our largest number of spring players ever, that Ottawa West Little League has established itself as a premier Little League program in Ontario and beyond. Not only does our executive work incredibly well together embracing new ideas and challenges, but we have grown every level of our programs so that all families can learn, have fun and develop. We have also continued to invest in 4 seasons of baseball programming accessible to all levels, hosted amazing local tournaments and Ontario provincials, as well as community building and connecting events like hosting the Stanley Cup. Building, growing and expanding is not something that can happen without the amazing support and energy of our volunteers. Please think about joining us and see how you can be a part of the OWLL community."

2023 AGM wrap up

REGISTRATION – Spring 2023 registration numbers were up over last year, slightly higher than our pre-covid peak. Summer and fall registrations dropped a bit compared to last year, again to numbers approximating pre-covid. Winter ball numbers are not yet available, as registration has not yet opened.

PLAYER AND COACH DEVELOPMENT – 2023 was a great for our coach development and our player development. We saw excellent progress on the fields and continued to improve our coach development programs and tools. Looking forward to 2024, we hope to grow our coach development team, develop age level specific skill level expectations and development plans, offer more support for our early stage coaches - rookie and minor, and enhance our pitcher and catcher development programs.

OPERATIONS – The Twins had a very successful year on the field that included a rookie A team winning the city championship, the minor all-stars making it to the finals at provincials, and the major all-stars qualifying for nationals! Our parent and coach surveys showed that overall families and coaches are happy with the league and how the programs are run, but that there are a few things that we can work on in the new year.

ADMIN – TeamSnap was once again used widely by teams in all four seasons, and we will continue to budget for it. For uniforms, we increased our jersey stocks to accommodate our growing junior and girls programs, added girls program hats, coach polos, and dryfits for all summer players. We are looking into offering a more permanent 'storefront' for parents and players to purchase OWLL swag. In 2024, we will need to invest in new hats for spring and summer. Photo day was offered to our tball and rookie players this year, with slots available for our older divisions on request basis. The summer banquet followed the same format as last year, and was well received.

UIC AND UMPIRE SCHEDULER – We had many new youth and adult umpires sign up to join our core of returning umpires, resulting in 47 umpires who officiated 706 house league and interlock games (this does not include the umpires who were asked to officiate district and provincials games, or those who mentored new officials as part of our new mentoring program). Next year, we hope to add some on-field training to our spring training, have more mentoring by senior officials, and offer an advanced clinic for umpires chosen for Little League tournaments.

FINANCIAL – OWLL's registration fees are responsible for the bulk of our revenue, with spring season accounting for almost half of the revenue, and the remainder coming from summer, fall, and winter. Fundraising and tournaments also contribute to the overall revenue. Expenditures are mainly split between uniform needs, winter facility rentals, field rentals, and umpire fees, with smaller amounts allocated to equipment, Little League fees, field maintenance, trophies and awards, website, insurance, and fees. In 2024, OWLL has planned for a major capital expense with the work at Pinecrest senior, and has a wish list that includes new tarps, a scoreboard, maintenance equipment, speakers, and additional bunkers.

WINTER BALL

Registration will open **November 8**, **2023** on our website. Winterball is a skills training program that runs January to March. The purpose of this program is to give players the opportunity to work on their baseball skills over the winter months at Sir Robert Borden High School, and the Sensplex. The program will start in January (various dates).

Our winterball program is run by volunteers (with guidance from experienced winterball coaches!) If you are interested in helping (especially for the girls programs and the rookie to major age groups), please contact Mike McLean. have sufficient Providing we volunteers, we plan to divide the programs into different age groups as follows:

Girls rookie & minor, ages 7-10, Sunday mornings at SRB

Girls major, ages 11-12, Sunday mornings at SRB

Girls junior, ages 13-15, Sunday mornings at SRB

Co-ed rookie, ages 7-8, Sunday afternoons at SRB

Co-ed minor-major, ages 9-12, Sunday afternoons at SRB

Co-ed junior-senior (first year) training, ages 13-15, Saturdays at Sensplex

Costs will vary by division, and be available on the registration form.

Due to limited space, priority is given to players in OWLL boundary.



2023 AGM wrap up (continued)

FIELDS AND CAPITAL PROJECTS – OWLL has made significant updates to local fields in the last three years (batting cage, Pinecrest major, Pinecrest Junior). This year we improved the dugouts at Britannia and laid the groundwork for upcoming work at Pinecrest senior (2024), and hopefully Ainsley (2025). In 2024, we are also planning for a new scoreboard, replacement tarps, and new maintenance equipment. We are looking for a new facilities lead to shadow our current lead for the 2024 senior diamond project, and take over the role at it's completion.

PROGRAMS – *Tball*: Bigger program again this year, and we will be adding more fields/nights next year. *Rookie*: continues to grow and get stronger, will run with 2 games a week + practices again next year. *Minor*: we had a lot of new families and coaches this year, will add more focus on developing coaches as well as players in 2024. *Major*: many new families and coaches here too, hoping to add another practice/game field for spring. *Junior/senior*: we had a robust program again this year, including many new to baseball junior aged players so we will look to help support coaches and these players in the coming year.

GIRLS BASEBALL – Our girls programs continued to see growth city wide this year. There were also several successful exhibition games (including the major and junior showcase games during major provincials) and a fantastic junior girls tournament to end the season. Moving forward, we will continue to tweak the rules to more closely match the co-ed rules, plan to lengthen the season til the end of July in 2024, and look to offer two teams at each division from rookie to major.

ELECTIONS – We held elections for a number of positions on the Board. Sarah Futterer (President), Frances Chan (Registrar), and Charleen Glover (Treasurer) were all re-elected, and Greg Milks (VP Admin) Sara Krenosky (several roles!) and Justin MerrIles (Fall Convenor) were welcomed to the board!
