2023 wrap-up

From spring house league to summer interlock to fall development, our players had lots of fun and saw much improvement. We hosted and played in many tournaments, celebrating the victories and learning from the losses.

District play saw our juniors and seniors play in the finals, and our minor and major teams win the right to represent the district at provincials! The minor team had an excellent tournament in Timmins, finishing in second place.

OWLL hosted two provincial tournaments – first up was the intermediates, where five teams from around the province played. OWLL made it to the semi-finals, but did not advance beyond. The second provincial was the major tournament, where the OWLL team won a thrilling two game final to win the right to represent Ontario at nationals. At Canadians, OWLL had a great tournament, but lost a tie-break and did not make it into the semi-finals.

2023, by the numbers

We offered Winter, Spring, Summer, and Fall programming in 2023.

- Winter indoor skills training was offered for prospects, and coed & girls open divisions.

69 players in the open sessions 60 players in the prospects

- Spring house season ran from mid-May until end of June (Girls and GOBL extended into summer) with 657 total participants *Coed*
