ALL ABOUT GEAR

One of the most common questions that we get at the beginning of any season is: "what gear does my player need?!" OWLL does provide the following equipment to all teams:

- Bats
- Baseballs
- Catcher's equipment (glove, chest protector mask, & shin guards)

For players in t-ball and rookie, a t-shirt will be given to the player. For minor and up, an OWLL jersey is loaned to the player for the season.

At all levels, players are REQUIRED to provide the following items:

- An athletic protector (jock/jill)
- Batting helmet
- Glove
- Long pants

Players may also wish to provide the following OPTIONAL items:

- Grey baseball pants (they are more durable than track pants)
- Batting gloves
- Water bottle
- Bat (<u>must meet little league</u> standards)
- Rubber cleats/soccer cleats (Rookie and up)

If parents have any questions, they can reach out to their child's coach.

How does Spring Ball work??

We often get questions about how spring ball works – from registration to the games to the end of the season. We hope that this section will help to explain how it all works for the spring season, for new and returning families!

Register – The first step is to register your child. Registration opens on February 4th this year, and the link to the registration form is shared on our website and social media. Players are placed programs based on their Little League age (see page two), and the form will let you know which section they belong in. Registration is typically open until March 31st, but some sections fill up quickly, especially in T-Ball. Payment is due with registration. If a family needs to discuss payment options or sponsorship, we can help!

Sort outs – The next step is sort outs. These are held in April, at an indoor facility. The goal of Spring Ball is to provide a safe, fun, developmental environment for players, coaches, umpires, and parents. In order to do that, we want to make sure that kids are playing with and against players of a similar skill level. It's an important step in ensuring that the players have a successful season.



Team placement / contact by coaches – Once the sort outs are completed, the convenors draft the teams based on the evaluations. We strive to have teams that are as balanced as possible, and it generally works out pretty well because of the evaluation process. There are tiers in the coed division so players are placed on teams at the National (B) or Canadian (A) level within their age group. Coaches will contact all players once the teams are set.



Practices and games – We are able to use the fields as soon as they are dry enough after May 1. Coaches set practices based on their availability and teams should count on a minimum of one game and one practice per week (some levels will have more). The spring season is a "House League", so coed rookie through Major teams will play other OWLL teams, whereas junior to GOBL and girls will play interlock against other teams in the city.

Most seasons run til late June, save for girls, which runs until late July, and GOBL, which runs til mid-August.



OWLL has a number of opportunities available for local businesses looking to support our league. How do I know what age/level my child is?

The level of play is determined by your child's <u>*Little League age*</u> as determined by the Little League Age Chart. To use the chart below, find the month and year of your child's birth and match it with their Little League age (in blue, on the right).

These rules, set by OWLL, in accordance with Little League rules, ensure that players learn the game safely with their peers.
