We offered Winter, Spring, Summer, and Fall programming in 2023.

Winter indoor skills training was offered for prospects, and coed & girls open divisions.

115 players in the open sessions43 players in prospects

Spring house season ran from mid May until end of June (girls and GOBL extended into summer) with 718 total participants

Fall season was six+ weeks, mostly training, with some exhibition games, and 317 participants.
