ALL ABOUT GEAR

One of the most common questions that we get at the beginning of any season is: "what gear does my player need?!" OWLL does provide the following equipment to all teams:

- Bats
- Baseballs
- Catcher's equipment (glove, chest protector mask, & shin guards)

For players in t-ball and rookie, a t-shirt will be given to the player. For coed junior and up, an OWLL jersey is loaned to the player for the season (rookie to major & all girls teams receive a dryfit to keep).

At all levels, players are REQUIRED to provide the following items:

- An athletic protector (jock/jill)
- Batting helmet
- Glove
- Long pants

Players may also wish to provide the following OPTIONAL items:

- Baseball pants
- Batting gloves
- Water bottle
- Bat (<u>must meet little league</u> standards)
- Rubber cleats/soccer cleats (Rookie and up)

If parents have any questions, they can reach out to their child's coach.




Photo days will likely be mid-May

March and April recap

As we anxiously await the start of the baseball season, a brief look back at April, the first of many busy months through the end of summer...

WINTERBALL TRAINING – Our winterball training sessions continued through April for many groups, concluding late in the month.

SORT OUTS – between April 5th and April 19th we held 20 different sort out sessions where hundreds of players in our co-ed and girls programs, from rookie to senior divisions, were evaluated for team placement.



TEAM PLACEMENT – This process started immediately after each sort out session and is ongoing. Convenors are reviewing evaluations to draft balanced teams. Teams will be finalized by the first weekend in May.



UMPIRE TRAINING – OWLL umpires attended three different training sessions in March/April – advanced for some of our senior umpires, a development clinic for intermediate umpires, and the OWLL training for over 50 of our newest umpires – a one day course designed to provide (or review) the basics for umpiring.

COACH TRAINING – Many of our new and experienced coaches came together in several sessions to talk about the tips and tools that help with coaching little league baseball.

PLAYER AND COACH DEVELOPMENT SESSIONS – New this year, we hosted several development sessions for coaches and players together, where an experienced coach led the players in workshops specific to pitching, hitting, or catching, and helped the coaches to understand how to better teach their players these skills.

DAY TO DAY OPERATIONS – All of our behind the scenes volunteers are working together to ensure that the uniforms are ready, the equipment is purchased, the tools for field maintenance are prepped for day one, schedules are built, umpires are ready to be assigned, teams and players are added to Sportsheadz, and the thousand other details!

Volunteering with OWLL

- Scorekeeping
- Pitch counting
- Umpiring (we are especially looking for adult umpires)
- Helping organize special events for the league
- Convenor for a division (we are looking for an assistant convenor for the Girls program!)
- Acting as game coordinator in games where there are two youth umpires
- Helping at practices
- Assuming a role on our board of directors or one of our committees
- Helping to make sure the bunkers at all of our fields stocked
