

Coaching with OWLL

Volunteer coaches are a critical component of any successful league. Coaching Little League is about more than developing players and baseball talent, it's about fostering a love of the game and providing a fun and meaningful baseball experience. We are always looking for people who want to help coach and are grateful to those who invest their time to help children learn to play baseball!

Coaching is also a great way to stay involved while your child plays the game. If you are interested in being a coach, assistant coach or t-ball helper for the upcoming season, this information is for you! Experience is not necessary to coach, but these are some of the skills that are beneficial to coaches: knowledge of baseball through experience, leadership, teaching abilities, understanding of children, organizational skills, and time. VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

The Safety Officer is primarily an administrative role, with the candidate responsible being for safety procedures and promoting a culture of safety within the league. The Field Prep Supervisor will work our maintenance volunteers to ensure that OWLL's fields are ready for our games, tournaments, and events, and that the bunkers have the tools necessary for game prep.



Call for Umpires!

OWLL is recruiting new and experienced umpires for the 2025 season. Children (aged 12 by Aug 31, 2025) and adults are welcome, no experience needed - we provide the training. TRAINING FOR 2025: The in-person training for umpires takes place on Saturday, April 12 from 9:00am – 3:00pm at Sir Robert Borden High School, 131 Greenbank road in the Cafeteria. Attendance is *mandatory* for all first- and second-year umpires, however, we would like ALL OWLL umpires to attend the clinic as an opportunity to brush up on rules and mechanics. Please bring a pen and paper along with your running shoes as we will be doing some mechanics work.



Pizza lunch will be provided half-way through the clinic. You must register on OWLL.ca prior to attending the training. Umpire training counts towards high school volunteer hours.

Game/Practice nights

One of the most common questions that we get in the lead-up to spring ball is "when will my player's games and practices be?" The short answer is that we can't say definitively until we confirm teams, coaches, and field availability. What we plan to do is keep the games for different divisions on the same nights each week, but practices are at the coach's discretion. Those nights are summarized here:

GAME/PRACTICE NIGHTS

T-BALL: Once a week at day/time/park specified at sign-up.

ROOKIE: Mon/Wed and possibly Sunday, may have an additional practice scheduled by coach.

MINOR: Games Tues/Thurs and possibly Sunday, plus practice scheduled by coach.

MAJOR: Games typically Mon/Wed, possibly any night Sunday - Thursday, plus practice scheduled by coach.

JUNIOR/SENIOR/GOBL: Generally two games, plus practice, can be any night Sun-Thurs.

GIRLS: Games are generally Sun, practice any night Mon-Thu (all levels)



GIRLS BASEBALL

Part of OWLL's commitment to increasing participation and the enjoyment of baseball in our community has been the growth of our Girls Baseball program. We are proud to offer programming specific to girls and players that identify as a girl to encourage fun, participation, and skill development in an inclusive environment. 2024 was another fantastic year for our girls program. We saw growth in the number participants, and in the levels and number of teams offered. The longer spring/summer season ran into late July, the teams attended (and WON)



tournaments, participated in another showcase event at the major Canadian championships, and the fall and winter development programs offered a great foundation for the coming season. We also saw significant changes to the playing rules, bringing them more in line with the coed rules.

We offer programs at the following levels (age based on Little League age):

T-Ball - For 4-6 years olds. Girls T-Ball is once a week on Sundays. We will introduce baseball fundamentals, including hitting, catching, throwing, running and fielding. The emphasis is on fun!

Rookie - For 7-8 year olds. Players are introduced to hitting against live pitching (coach pitched).

Minor - For girls aged 9-10 years olds, players are introduced to player pitching and complete Little League rules.

Major - For 11-12 year olds. Players continue to develop their passion and skill for the game, experiencing more hitting and fielding.

Junior/Senior – For girls aged 13-16 years old. As we look to grow our program to include senior teams, this year's teams will feature junior and senior aged players. Players will continue to build on the skills they have developed, on a larger diamond.

Girls teams will play games on Sunday (any time) and will interlock with other Ottawa Girls teams, and the season will end with playoffs. For rookie and up, practices twice a week are an important part of this program.
