## Prepping for the season

We are getting ready for sort outs, recruiting and training umpires, and looking forward to putting together teams and coaches for spring, but also looking ahead to planning for summer ball and district and provincial tournaments. It's going to be a fantastic year for baseball!

The weather this month has been very up and down, but we are hoping for a May first start to our baseball season. We are, however, at the mercy of the City of Ottawa and when they have prepped and released the fields to sports teams. For now, please remember that Ottawa's ball fields are still closed and should not be used \*yet\*. As much as we may have great weather for going out and chucking a ball around some days, please stay off the ball diamonds/sports fields to protect them for baseball season!

Winterball seasons are wrapping up for some groups, and continuing into April for others. They have been a great success again this year. This training offers an opportunity for many of our players to work on their throwing, fielding, hitting, and other skills over the winter months. Thank you to all of our coaches and volunteers for making the sessions a fantastic experience for all involved.

#### **ALL ABOUT GEAR**

One of the most common questions that we get at the beginning of any season is: "what gear does my player need?!" OWLL does provide the following equipment to all teams:

- Bats
- Baseballs
- Catcher's equipment (glove, chest protector mask, & shin guards)

For players in t-ball and rookie, a t-shirt will be given to the player. For coed junior and up, an OWLL jersey is loaned to the player for the season (rookie to major & all girls teams receive a dryfit to keep).

At all levels, players are REQUIRED to provide the following items:

- An athletic protector (jock/jill)
- Batting helmet
- Glove
- Long pants

Players may also wish to provide the following OPTIONAL items:

- Baseball pants
- Batting gloves
- Water bottle
- Bat (<u>must meet little league</u> standards)
- Rubber cleats/soccer cleats (Rookie and up)

If parents have any questions, they can reach out to their child's coach.



## April is sort out month!

The goal of spring ball is to provide a safe, fun, developmental environment for players and coaches. In order to do that, we want to make sure that kids are playing with and against players of a comparable skill level. All sort outs are held at an indoor facility (either the Kanata Sensplex Fieldhouse or Sir Robert Borden High School gym).

The goal of the sort outs is to create teams that are balanced with similarly skilled players so that the season is fun for everyone. To accomplish that, all players are asked to attend the sort out for their division, where they will be required to run trough a series of drills to evaluate throwing, fielding, batting, and movement. After completing the drills, the evaluation data will be used to place each player in one of the two streams of play - A/Canadian or B/National, and then divide them onto teams. There may be several revisions to ensure balance.

The sort outs take place over two weekends, and players are divided by division and last name. The full sort out schedule can be seen below, but it will also be shared via e-mail, on our website, and our social media accounts. Sort outs will be completed by April 13<sup>th</sup>.

Players are asked to wear comfortable clothes (t-shirt and baseball pants/sweat pants), a jock/jill, running shoes or indoor cleats (no outdoor cleats permitted), and bring a helmet, glove, water, and a bat if they have one. Players should plan on arriving no more that 15 minutes before their time slot. They must sign in, collect their number or numbered pinnie and prepare for warm up and the evaluation activities.

After the teams are formed, coaches are given their rosters and will contact their players. The league tries to complete this process as quickly as possible to give the coaches as much lead time as they can before the season starts.
